In February, we notified you that we no longer have access to Interagency Mail, and encouraged you to start sending forms to us electronically, either via fax or email. At that time, we also reminded you to never send a document that contains a full social security number. Since that time, we've received several documents via email from you. For the most part, you have all been pretty good about not sending information that contains the member's social security number....but don't forget about their beneficiaries. Even though only the member's last four digits of their social security number may be on a form, if you are sending in a beneficiary form to our office (which we do need the beneficiary's full social security number on), these cannot be sent via email, unless the email is encrypted.
